

The Irish tenor Donal J. Byrne was born in Dublin and studied there at the DIT Conservatory of Music and Drama where he won many prizes including bursaries from the Irish Arts Council. Since 1994 he has lived in Bruxelles, Belgium.

Some of the renowned conductors Donal has worked with include Rinaldo Alessandrini, Maurizio Barbacini, Bertrand de Billy, Claus Peter Flor, Philippe Herreweghe, Kazushi Ono, Antonio Pappano, Colman Pearce, Julian Reynolds, David Robertson, and the late Marcello Viotti. He has collaborated with stage directors such as Willy Decker, Franà §ois de Carpentries, Dale Duesing, Achim Freyer, Karl-Ernst and Ursel Herrmann, Yannis Kokkos, Robert Lepage, Christof Loy, Omar Porras and Stein Winge. As well as television and radio broadcasts in Ireland, Belgium, France and Malaysia Donal had a cameo role in the film â Widows Peakâ in which he sang to Mia Farrow.

Future projects for Donal include Sellem in Robert Lepage's production of â The Rakeâ s Progressâ of Stravinsky at La Scala, Milan in 2009 and Froh in â Das Rheingoldâ at the Edinburgh Festival in 2009 and in Essen, Germany 2010.

This season with the Th $A \otimes A$ etre Royal de la Monnaie in Bruxelles he sings roles in two new productions Ein Hirt/Ein junger Seeman in â Tristan und Isoldeâ â and Sellem in Stravinskyâ s â The s Progressâ . Also at the Monnaie Donal has sung the role of Ernesto in their production of Rakeâ Don Pasqualeâ ; Heinrich der Schreiber in â Tannhauserâ ; Kunz Vogelgesang in â â Die Meistersinger von $N\tilde{A}^{4}$ rnbergâ ; Giovinetto in Paisielloâ s â Il Barbiere di Sivigliaâ and he created the role of *â* Primo Invitato*â* in the world premiere of Luca Francesconiâ s opera Ballataâ . Other productions at la Monnaie include roles in â Le Nozze Di Figaroâ . â â Il Tabarroâ, â Die Zauberflöteâ and â Idomeneoâ . As a member of the Opera Studio of the ThÂOA¢tre Royal de la Monnaie he sang the roles of Tamino in \hat{a} Die Zauberfl¶te \hat{a} and Ferrando in Belgium, France, Holland and Germany. in â Cosi Fan Tutteâ

For Oper Frankfurt Donal has sung in a number of productions â two operas of Dallapiccola â Volo (Un Impiegato) and \hat{a} Il Prigioniero \hat{a} (Un Sacerdote); the roles of Don Luigino, di Notteâ Gelsomino and Antonio in Rossiniâ s â Il Viaggio a Reimsâ and as Dr. Blind in â Die in concert at the Alte Oper, Frankfurt. Other recent engagements include a trip to Fledermausâ Malaysia where Donal sang Pinkerton in â Madama Butterflyâ and Alfredo in â La Traviataâ for the Penang Arts Council in Penang and Kuala Lumpur. In France roles include Ferrando in â Cosi fan Tutteâ for the ScÃ[•]ne Nationale dâ Orléans; Heinrich der Schreiber in â Tannhauserâ and Maestro Trabuco in \hat{a} La Forza del Destino \hat{a} for the Op \tilde{A} [©]ra de Rouen. In Luxembourg he sang

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the role of Gherardo in Robert Carsen's production of Gianni Schicchi. On tour in the Netherlands he sang Orph \tilde{A} [©]e in Offenbach \hat{a} s \hat{a} Orph \tilde{A} [©]e Aux Enfers \hat{a} . With the Vlaamse Opera in Belgium he has sung the role of Ascanio in their production of \hat{a} Lo Frate \hat{A} 'nnamorato \hat{a} (Pergolesi) in Antwerp and Ghent.

In his native Ireland roles have included Ferrando in Opera Theatre Companyâ s production of â Cosi Fan Tutteâ . He has worked with Opera Ireland in productions of â Marthaâ and \hat{a} La and with other companies around Ireland in productions including â Rigolettoâ Bohemeâ - Duca - Don Ottavio; â Albert Herringâ (Britten) - Mayor Upfold; di Mantova; â Don Giovanniâ The Bohemian Girlâ Camille and â (Balfe) â Thaddeus; â Die Lustige Witweâ â Bastien und Bastienneâ â â Bastien.

In concert and oratorio Donalâ s repertoire includes performances of BachÂ's â B Minor Massâ St. Sulpice) & the â St. Matthew Passionâ ; Mahlerâ s â Das Lied Von Der Erdeâ (Paris â (la Monnaie, Bruxelles); concert performances of Chueccaâ s and Bernsteinâ sâ Songfestâ â La Gran Viaâ and Caballeroâ s â El Duo De La Africanaâ ; Handelâ s â Messiahâ (Dublin). With the Brussels Operettetheater he has sung and Rossiniâ s â Petite Messe Solennelleâ Symon Rymanowicz in â Der Bettelstudentâ (Millöcker); Caramello in â Eine Nacht In (Strauss); Astolf in â Die Verschworenenâ (Schubert) and Ange Pitou in â La Fille De Venedigâ Madame Angotâ (Lecocq).
